Dear CAO Harrower,

Please find attached the quarterly Community Policing Report covering the period from January 1st to March 31th, 2025. This report provides a snapshot of human resources, financial data, and crime statistics for the Vermilion Detachment.

As we approach summer, I would like to highlight the preparations that the Alberta RCMP have made to address what may be another busy wildfire season. The wildfire seasons of 2023 and 2024 have provided our organization with many lessons on the best ways to handle the unpredictability of wildfires. In March, we began planning for the 2025 wildfire season and this included the early staffing of our Division Emergency Operations Center (DEOC). In the past two years, DEOC has been the cornerstone of the police response to the wildfires in Alberta. The members and staff in DEOC are able to process information from various sources to determine the most optimal way to deploy police resources in areas under threat of wildfires.

Depending on the severity of the fire season, it may be necessary to draw resources from your police service to ensure the safety of people and property in affected communities. I want to assure you that the Alberta RCMP will keep the needs of your community in mind and will work to deploy only the resources which will not adversely impact the security of our own community. The Alberta RCMP remains ready to respond to wildfires in coordination with other provincial resources to protect our citizens and communities.

Updates and Comments:

56 curfew checks were completed this quarter, bringing the total to 200. Goal (100) was exceeded.

Priority #2: Police / Community Relations - Consultations and Connections

Updates and Comments:

A second Town Hall was held on February 4, 2025, at Innisfree Seniors Drop-in Centre. Approximately 20 attendees. 2 of 2 Town Halls completed and the initiative was met.

32 public communications were completed, including media releases, Voyent/RAVE alerts, and Facebook posts. The Vermilion RCMP Facebook page went live on February 14, 2025. Total public communications for the year were 67 out of the goal of 50. Initiative was exceeded.

Priority #3: Police / Community Relations - Police Visibility

Updates and Comments:

193 documented vehicle stops were completed during quarter 4, bringing the annual total to 614 (out of 360). This initiative was well exceeded.

2 checkstops were completed, bringing it to a total of 7 checkstops this year, exceeding the initiative.

BACKGROUND

The Town of Vermilion had previously adopted an Investment Policy back on September 25, 1997 which established vague parameters on the investment of municipal funds. As a means of updating our processes and ensuring that we are in line with municipal standards, administration has reviewed the investment practices of neighboring and similar sized municipalities. In consideration thereof, administration is recommending that new investments be made through a Call For Investments or Tendering Process, as determined by the CAO and/or Director of Corporate Services. Investment proposals received through a Call For Investments and/or Tendering Process shall be evaluated based on: Term; Liquidity; Risk; and Yield.

Moving forward, instead of specifying the exact types of accounts we can invest in, administration will conduct a call for investments in which local lending institutions have the ability to provide their competitive rates for consideration and the Town may invest in those accounts that have the greatest potential, manageable risk, and favorable terms.

IMPLICATIONS

The adoption of a policy to standardize and establish the procedure by which the Town of Vermilion invests municipal funds is paramount to fiscal responsibility and accountability.

PURPOSE

To establish the process by which the Town of Vermilion may make investments with its money in accordance with the Municipal Government Act to maximize investment revenue while responsibly safeguarding the interests of the taxpayers.

DEFINITIONS

Administration is the administrative Employees of the Town of Vermilion.

Call for Investments is a process by which the Town of Vermilion will seek competitive investment opportunities from local financial institutions.

CAO is the Chief Administrative Officer for the Town of Vermilion.

Director is a person employed by the Town of Vermilion who is in charge of an activity, department or organization, as delegated by the CAO.

Employee is an employee of the Town of Vermilion.

Liquidity is the ability to convert an investment into cash without the loss of principal and/or earning a reasonable rate of return.

Manager is a person employed by the Town of Vermilion who is in charge of an activity, department or organization, as delegated by the CAO.

Tendering Process is the circulation of a call for investments to seek competitive investment opportunities from financial institutions that may not be local to the Town of Vermilion.

Town is the Town of Vermilion in the Province of Alberta.

Town Business is professional services rendered for or on behalf of the Town of Vermilion.

Yield is the optimum rate of return on an investment.

SCOPE

This policy applies to All Members of Council and/or all Employees of the Town of Vermilion.

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- The CAO and/or the Director of Corporate Services have the authority to manage the Town's investments.
- As delegated by the CAO, the Director of Corporate Services must:
 - Establish appropriate guidelines, procedures and internal controls to achieve the objectives identified within this policy;
 - Oversee the overall implementation strategy process;
 - Ensure that non-negotiable cash and short-term investment certificates and records are maintained appropriately; and
 - Provide a summary of the investment activities of the Town in the form of a quarterly report to Council listing the specific investment, interest rate, maturity date, and any other pertinent information deemed appropriate by the CAO.
- New investments shall be made through a Call For Investments or Tendering Process, as determined by the CAO and/or Director of Corporate Services.
- Investment proposals received through a Call For Investments and/or Tendering Process shall be evaluated based on:
 - Term;
 - Liquidity;

- Risk; and
 - Yield.
- Cash flow must be closely monitored in order to accurately project the amount of cash available for investment and the length of time any cash invested would be made available again.
- As cash flows are significantly impacted by large capital projects, Directors and Managers shall be asked for project outflows by the Director of Corporate Services during the annual budgeting process.
- A combination of redeemable and non-redeemable investments may be used in order to maximize the benefit to the Town so long as they adhere to the terms of this policy and Town bylaws.
- This policy hereby rescinds the Town of Vermilion's previous Investment Policy approved by Council on September 25, 1997 via motion 97-09-166.

ELIGIBILITY

- This policy applies to all monies under the management of the Town of Vermilion with the exception of cash allocated through the budgeting process and approved by Council toward the immediate payment of operational and capital expenditures which may not be used for investment purposes.
- An investment must not be made if it will cause an overdraft in the Town's bank accounts or require interim financing.
- The maximum term of any investment is not to exceed five (5) years.
- At any time, the total investments at any one financial institution must not equate to over sixty percent (60%) of the reserve balance stated in the prior year's audited financial statements.

Title: Investment Policy

Policy Statement:

1. THAT, the elected representatives have a responsibility to the taxpayers to preserve and protect the assets entrusted to them. In this regard, it is their responsibility to ensure all assets are properly safeguarded and are invested to the benefit of the Town.
2. THAT, there are numerous investment alternatives available which will provide for a return to the Town. The rate of return will vary for the most part with the risk associated with the investment. The greater the risk the greater the expected return. The greater the risk the greater the potential to lose money.
3. THAT, Administration be authorized to invest through the local financial institutions including Chartered Banks, Credit Unions and Treasury Branches.
4. THAT, Administration be authorized to invest any operating surpluses or other money of the Town of Vermilion, that is not required for immediate disbursement in any of the following securities that are 100% guaranteed:
 - a) Guaranteed Term Deposit
 - b) Government of Canada T-Bills
 - c) GIC's (CDIC insures banks to \$60,000)
 - d) Bankers Acceptances (Must be unconditionally guaranteed by the issuing bank. i.e. third party guarantees are not acceptable.)

The purpose of this policy is to:

Establish an investment policy for the Town which will maximize investment income while taking into account the protection of the investment and the greater good of the taxpayers.

REQUEST FOR DECISION

SUBJECT

Waiver of Rental Fees for Physicians at the Midtown Medical Clinic

RECOMMENDATION

That the Town of Vermilion approve the waiver of outstanding rental fees as well as provide a three (3) month waiver of all future rental fees for physicians relocating to the area.

OR

That the Town of Vermilion receive the request for the waiver of outstanding rental fees as well as the request to provide a three (3) month waiver of all future rental fees for physicians relocating to the area as information.

BACKGROUND

The previous CAO of the Town of Vermilion had made verbal agreements to provide a select few doctors who had relocated to the area with a three (3) month waiver of rental fees in the midtown medical clinic. This matter was discussed at length by the Vermilion District Health Care Providers Attraction and Retention Committee as an opportunity for their board to consider as opposed to being funded solely by the Town of Vermilion.

At the April 17, 2025 meeting, the Committee made the following motion:

Moved By Leslie Cusack "That the Health Care Providers Attraction and Retention Committee approve the waiver of outstanding rental fees as well as provide a three (3) month waiver of all future rental fees for physicians relocating to the area." **DEFEATED.**

As a result of the aforementioned motion, the Town of Vermilion has the option to either approve the rental fee waiver and include this as a budget item moving forward, or, deny the request for the fee waiver and communicate to the physicians within the clinic as well as those relocating to the area to practice in the clinic that there are no rental fee waivers of any kind on behalf of the Town of Vermilion or on behalf of the Vermilion District Health Care Providers Attraction and Retention Committee.

Councillor Robert Snow forwarded a request to administration from Counselling Alberta inviting the Town of Vermilion to proclaim October 9, 2025 as National Depressing Screen Day.

Since 2005, Counselling Alberta and Calgary Counselling Centre have hosted National Depression Screening Day as a free public service to raise awareness about depression and the importance of checking in on our mental health. Each year for one week in October, Albertans are encouraged to visit areyoufeelingok.com to take a free, anonymous online screening for symptoms of depression. The screening doesn't provide a diagnosis but helps identify signs of depression and encourages people to seek support if needed.

Last year, nearly 2,500 Albertans used the online screening tool—and many more accessed counselling services through Counselling Alberta, including individuals from your own community. A local proclamation would help normalize conversations about mental health, reduce stigma, and encourage even more people to take that first step toward feeling better.

Counselling Alberta is a division of Calgary Counselling Centre, offering professional, affordable online counselling to individuals across the province, as well as in-person services in Edmonton, Fort McMurray, Grande Prairie, Lethbridge, Medicine Hat, and Red Deer. We offer a sliding fee scale, no waitlist, and services in multiple languages to ensure support is accessible to all Albertans.

The Honourable Ric McIver provided a copy of the letter sent to you regarding topics discussed at the Alberta Municipalities Spring 2025 Municipal Leaders' Caucus. As Minister of Transportation and Economic Corridors, I appreciate the opportunity to provide the following information.

Regarding your request for information on funding opportunities for infrastructure, I am pleased to advise Transportation and Economic Corridors administers the Strategic Transportation Infrastructure Program (STIP) program which provides funding to support smaller municipalities in developing and maintaining critical transportation infrastructure, to promote economic growth and improve mobility. Financial assistance is provided to Alberta municipalities (excluding large cities) to invest in capital construction and rehabilitation of important local transportation infrastructure, through cost-shared funding in the program's four components:

- Local Road Bridge Program: Up to 75 per cent provincial funding is available to support local bridge projects, including engineering, maintenance, rehabilitation, and replacement.
- Community Airport Program: Up to 75 per cent provincial funding is available to support safe operations and general aviation at public-use community airports. This program helps economic growth, forest fire suppression and medivac operations.

- Resource Road Program: Up to 50 per cent provincial funding is available to support new or improved road infrastructure that helps industrial growth, value added processing, and agricultural sectors.
- Local Municipal Initiatives Program: Up to 50 per cent provincial funding is available to support local priority transportation infrastructure not eligible under other components of STIP.

STIP has an annual application intake deadline of November 30 and project applications are rated on a provincewide, competitive basis. You can find more information about STIP online at www.alberta.ca/stip.

Town Council & Interim CAO,

I appreciate Deputy Mayor Rayment's opportunity for a quick discussion and like him (and I am sure you all), I want to put this concern to rest. I can promise you that I have many other things I can do with my time but questions remain on the true cost of the broadband project to our community. I am gravely concerned with the verbal response from the Deputy Mayor of "We can't get much clearer than this" in regards to the latest response provided to me.

Timely Communication

I first want to address timely communication. It's been over 75 days since I first asked my questions. At the council meeting last week, I finally received the level of information I was asking for back then. Instead, initially I was answered with unquantified responses that forced me to continually pry for answers. Why was your response that was an attachment to the January 21st council meeting, which is **undated, unnamed, and unsigned**, not the first reply I received back in November? This untimely communication caused unnecessary stress and inefficiencies.

Municipal Response

Continuing with the response,

- A) Why was it held until last minute to be uploaded as an attachment?
- B) Why was I, who the response was directed to, not informed of the reply?

I just happened to stumble upon the council agenda over the previous weekend and saw my letter itemized under Correspondence. That is why I took the time out of my schedule to attend the meeting. And then **during the meeting** to notice a second 'paperclip' on the screen in council chambers sparking curiosity on my part and having to quickly read the response was blindsiding.
- C) Please confirm to me the date and time that the letter was drafted (when did Councillors see it)?
- D) When was it uploaded to CivicWeb?

Do we not agree it should be sent to the writer directly as well? Lastly on the response, you praised the auditor. Being unfamiliar with them I gave the firm a quick Google search. "Summary of the findings of unprofessional conduct" is the top result.

Merit of Recognition

As it seemed to hold extreme merit in both verbal comments at the council meeting and in the response received, I just need to note that your Government Finance Officers Association's (GFOA) Distinguished Budget Presentation Award is for just that, budgets... not financial statements. And I hate to take the wind out of your sails but when 1,763 other members win an award (see attached spreadsheet) from an association you're a member of, it just doesn't make me feel any more comfortable with what I am seeing. The GFOA's award is strictly a checklist, **it holds no value of fiscal accuracy within the Town of Vermilion's financial being.**

Provided Non-Existing Information

Just to outline the lack of transparency I have received thus far, on November 13th, 2024 a Councillor stated to me in an email: *“For reference to the final payment for broadband, you can access the Public Council meeting minutes for Dec 19th of 2023. During this meeting, we were presented with the financial statement, which shows the final payment to Alberta Broadband of \$800,000.00. All of our payments have been recorded and presented during public council meetings.”*

I looked at those minutes and see no transparent reference as outlined above
(<https://vermilion.civicweb.net/filepro/documents/139122>)

Hidden Figures

It's nearly comical how an elected official says 'transparency'; yet what he is referencing I am left to assume is hidden in the "listings of accounts payable" totalling \$1,348,628.14. Nowhere in the document is \$800,000 referenced. Is the above \$800,000 transaction part of the \$2,400,000? When were the other payments totalling \$2,400,000 made? Please provide me with a full statement on payments made to this venture.

Alternative Examples

It is also worth asking, as senior leadership and councillors, are you aware of what the City of Beaumont spent to have broadband available to their community? **\$0.00**. Zero dollars were paid by the City of Beaumont to Alberta Broadband and/or its companies to provide their residents and businesses the exact same services that cost our community "\$2,400,000". Furthermore, did the town engage or investigate the clear opportunity when the **2022 Alberta Broadband Strategy was announced where \$780,000,000** was to be provided by the federal and provincial government to improve access to high-speed internet in rural communities?

Outstanding Questions

As questions remain, I outline them here below for a timely, accurate, clear, and quantifiable response and require direct references to financial statements with each answer where applicable. The unquantified figures that took an abnormal amount of time to be supplied to me in the last response do not clearly display the true fiscal situation.

- A) I find it quite interesting that the term A-Net was used for the first time in correspondence on this topic. Were the funds paid to A-Net the same as the funds paid to Alberta Broadband Networks (terms used interchangeably), or are those two different payees?
- B) 2023 Financial Statement Clarity Request:
 - i. Why are the financial statements unsigned?
 - ii. On the Consolidated Statement of Change in Net Financial Assets (Page 6), explain the **\$906,597 increase of disposal of tangible capital assets**.

- iii. Page 6, there is a line item unnamed that indicates an expense of \$39,239. What does this represent? *(I can now see why they are unsigned; I wouldn't want to put my name to this document.)*
- iv. Is the broadband venture considered a capital asset or an operating expense? On page 6, I can find the **\$617,405 loss** on sale of tangible capital assets you referenced in your reply to me. Indicating V-Net was an asset. However, I am left to assume A-Net is an operating expense within the \$2,583,677 increase in Contracted and general services.
- v. This is **\$2,277,371 over budget** (Page 10). Please explain how a budget and actual are so far apart.
- vi. On the Consolidated Statement of Cash Flows there's **\$1,650,000 in Long term debt issued**. It is clear that the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) standards are not being met as there is no note in regards to this long-term agreement. Please explain this long-term debt.
- vii. Unrelated to my initial concerns, but since you've provided me the opportunity to dig deep into the financial statements, it also appears that the Alberta Cemeteries Act is not being followed insuring perpetual care funds are placed in trust.
- viii. The Schedule of Accumulated Surplus on Page 11 indicates a transfer from operating to reserves **in the amount of \$2,034,117**. What was this increase in reserve intended for? And the schedule still outlines a **decline of assets amounting to \$2,999,382**.
- ix. Since we've already located the loss of the V-Net venture, then what is the **write-down of tangible capital assets in the category of Machinery and Equipment that equals \$1,049,400**.
- x. The Schedule of Segmented Disclosure on Page 13 shows a staggering \$2,550,409 expense in Contract and general services. When the previous year had an expense of \$259,320, I need to ask what the **\$2,291,089 increase** of service is related to.

One should expect the Notes to the Financial Statements would offer some insight, however they just cause more questions:

- xi. The Municipal Sustainability Initiative (MSI) Capital deferred revenue (Page 17, #6) appears to have been building up and then **\$504,310 was used in 2023**. What were those funds used towards and why haven't the balance of the funds been used?
- xii. MSI (now LGFF) projects have strict criteria of either capital or operating projects. Under which use was the MSI grant approved for the Broadband project?
- xiii. Long-Term Debt (Page 18, #9) discusses debentures. I've reviewed years of the Town of Vermilion financials and I can't see an increase of **\$2,400,000 as per Bylaw 6-2022**. Where in the financials does it show the use of the debenture loan?

C) Budget

- i. Since many of the financial questions lie within Economic Development, can you please also explain the abnormal increase projected in 2026 of \$148,000 when the years surrounding the same item are \$73,000?

Debenture Validity

Reviewing the Municipal Government Act (MGA) it outlines the 14-day advertising period followed by the 15-day petition opportunity. How could the 29 days needed for the process have happened when the first reading was signed October 18th, 2022 and the second and third reading on November 1st, 2022? And furthermore, advertising period (Section 606 of the MGA) **only works when it is actually advertised**. The digital copies of the Vermilion Voice for both October 25th, 2022 and November 1st, 2022 contain no notice to bylaw 6-2022.

Auditor

I very much so understand the need for reviewing and changing auditors of organizations. I just can't help but find it interesting that coincidentally during this time of lack of transparency the auditor changed to JDP Wasserman. A firm that has a mailing address in the same community from where our previous CAO, Kevin Lucas, came from. A past employee who **left the organization abruptly without explanation**. This doesn't require an answer, it just needs to be noted.

Official FOIP Request

Due to the level of concern on this manner, this letter is a formal Province of Alberta Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIP Act) request for the following:

All documents and payments related to Alberta Broadband Networks, Alberta Broadband, Meridiam, Digital Infrastructure Group, V-Net, A-Net, O-Net, Primus, Primus Telecommunications, Distributel, Bell Canada, Connect Mobility, Hook'd, Victor Energy Ltd, and Canadian Radio Television and Telecommunications Commission along with subject areas of telecommunications/broadband from the period of 2017 – 2025.

Because the FOIP coordinator for the Town of Vermilion (attached) has not been updated, **please insure and confirm** this is received by the proper individual.

On the new website, many of the pages are inoperable or not complete. For example:

<https://www.vermilion.ca/your-government/freedom-of-information-and-privacy/> indicates there is a "Access to Information Request" form, however it is not available. Again, find this letter as my formal request. General information request for myself, Shawn Jacula [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] It is my understanding public bodies have 30 calendar days to respond.

I respect the Director of Corporate Services, [REDACTED] unwillingness to engage in back-and-forth discussion during the Council meeting on January 21st, 2025 and his disclaimer of not being the manager of the project was noted. To respect his wishes and for this concern to finally get true qualified answers, once the FOIP request is supplied and all questions answered to me directly in writing, I will reach out to administration for a meeting.

This letter is to be included in correspondence for the February 4th, 2025 Regular Meeting of Council.

As I made it clear at the last Council meeting and I will say it again, I am not against broadband, communication, or growth like some of you are trying to paint. I am a dedicated local business owner, investor, taxpayer, and advocate for this community. I refuse to accept anything less than what our great community deserves. Your lack of timely cooperation and transparency is unacceptable. It's time for full transparency so we can address and resolve the chaos within the municipal finances. Our community's future is at stake.

Simply put, if it really is \$2,400,000 by the proper means – prove it... you haven't yet,
